These A-G Completion Improvement Grant funds will be used to increase and improve our A-G offerings for foster youth, low-income students, and English learners. Our first area of focus will be on Visual Arts. We are looking to hire a credentialed Art teacher whose part-time salary will be paid through this grant for the 22/23, 23/24, 24/25, & 25/26 school years. We will be adding a ceramics, sculpture and other mixed media offerings that we have not been able to offer before. This plan would also help increase and improve the A-G science and social sciences classes for the previously named school years in ways that our teachers & Director determine to be timely & relevant. This plan will be updated as it evolves.
